




A newborn orca is longer than a bed.


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An orca's nose is on top of its head. It is called a blowhole.







# AN ACORN BECO

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An acorn from an oak tree begins to grow. Its new roots reach down into the ground.






Leaves begin to grow on the little tree. The leaves reach up toward the sun.

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
